### A Summary of the 70th ACA meeting held on 9 April 2010

## **70th ACA Meeting**

### **Complaint by NGOs on Confiscation of condoms by Police Officers**

Members noted that a liaison mechanism had already been in place since May 2008 to maintain communication with non-government organisations (NGOs) and sex workers to address matters of mutual concern. With a view to stepping up the dialogue, the Police had met the sex workers six times in 2009 compared with only twice in 2008. Since all properties seized by the Police were required to be properly recorded and subject to audit checks, the Police would not seize any property unless it is lawful

to do so and considered necessary for Police purposes. NGOs were suggested to record down the incidents of unreasonable seizure of condoms. In case there was prima-facie evidence of abuse by Police, they could make a formal complaint to the Police for investigation. The meeting agreed that there was no need for further action at this stage. If the NGO could come up with a specific case, the Police would investigate.

### **HIV Str**ategy and Situation in Macao

The overall HIV rate in Macao had been maintained at a relatively low level. Sexual transmission had continued to be the major mode of HIV spread in respect of both local and non-Macao residents. The meeting noted that similar to Hong Kong, Macao had an AIDS Commission to advise on prevention and control strategies. Recently, Macao was

working on legislations conducive to HIV prevention for public health purpose, e.g. methadone treatment and syringe programme targeting drug users. Patients with or at risk of sexually transmitted infections could either turn to private clinic or clinic subvented by the Government which provided service for non-local residents in particular for treatment.

### "Find One Treat One" : a Strategy to Prevent HIV-1 Spread in Hong Kong

One" strategy, antiretroviral therapy should be provided to all infected and newly infected men who had sex with men (MSM). To prevent new infections among MSM, it was essential to prevent these spreaders from passing their viruses to their partners. Since acute infection was important in HIV-1 transmission dynamics among MSM where there were high rates of partner change, it was necessary to provide effective ART to all infected and newly infected MSM immediately to minimize the number of secondary infections. As AIDS physicians in Hong Kong had excellent

Under the proposed "Find One Treat records of treating patients with high adherence rate and few drug resistance issues, the best way to control an epidemic is always to eliminate the source of infections at the very early stage. Members opined that the prime prevention measure of sexual transmission was condom use. There could be ethical concern if the aim of treatment was to benefit other rather than the patient himself. The meeting considered that more information and scientific evidence should be collected before the proposal could be studied in details.
