A Summary of the 82nd ACA Meeting held on 12 April 2013

Public health response to MSM HIV epidemic in Hong Kong

The HIV situation in Hong Kong was still predominated by sexual transmission in the past few years, with MSM including homosexual and bisexual contact in men as the commonest routes. The MSM figures reported to DH rose from 68 cases (25%) in 2004 to 254 (49.5%) in 2012 among all newly reported cases in the same year. ACA also identified MSM as the top priority population for targeted HIV prevention in its last and current Recommended HIV/AIDS Strategies. Members were briefed on the current response to the HIV epidemic among MSM which could be broadly categorized as follows –

- ♦ securing resources;
- ♦ concerted prevention, care and control efforts; and
- ♦ collaboration with overseas and regional counterparts.

It was noticed that despite the various moderate and soft messages on HIV prevention disseminated in the past few years, the number of new MSM continued to rise. Alternative stronger approaches might be worth reconsideration to warn the public of the possible serious consequences of unprotected sex including HIV infection. Moreover, MSM should be reminded of the rising trend of HIV infection among their community which was the current epidemiologic situation.

In controlling infectious diseases including HIV/AIDS, Hong Kong had all along taken reference of the recommendations of World Health Organization. While treatment of HIV infection could reduce the risk of onward transmission, the practice of safer sex in particular using condom effectively prevent HIV and other sexually transmitted diseases. Under the current programme, partner referral was in place together with HIV management, and doctors were encouraged to report any infection to DH through the existing reporting system.

Report of the Community Forum on AIDS

Members were briefed on the major discussion of the 28th CFA Meeting held on 14 March 2013 (and a summary of this CFA Meeting was given in the ACA Newsfile issued in May 2013).

Self HIV test and its relevance to Hong Kong

Members agreed that relevant information should be made readily available to those who intended to use self HIV testing, while there was at present no legal restriction on sale of test kits in Hong Kong. Both the English and Chinese version of the relevant information (including potential false negatives and positives, the concept of window period, need of linkage to care once positive and ways to prevent HIV transmission) had been prepared and uploaded to the websites of DH on HIV/AIDS (included in the update of HIV testing and counseling). The information had also been shared with NGO stakeholders.

Review of HIV situation in Hong Kong as of 2012

Members were presented the updates of the HIV/AIDS statistics in Hong Kong gauged from the voluntary reporting system. There were 513 HIV cases and 86 AIDS cases newly reported in 2012. Cumulatively, DH had received 5,783 HIV reports and 1,353 AIDS cases as of 2012. While MSM infections stayed high, heterosexual male infections had been stable and female infections appeared to have some increase over time.
