
## **HIV/HCV Awareness Campaign 2014**

In response to the recent upsurge of new HIV cases among men who have sex with men (MSM) and an increase in hepatitis C infection in HIV-infected MSM seen at the Department of Health (DH), the Special Preventive Programme (SPP) has launched the "Be Negative" HIV and HCV awareness campaign and targeted publicity activities in NGOs, public clinics, gay venues and events are rolling out. Poster series of Be Negative Campaign with four main themes: (1) protect your partner; (2) always use a condom; (3) know about HIV and HCV; and (4) early testing.

## **Hong Kong Lesbian & Gay Film Festival**

Similar to last few years, the Red Ribbon Centre (RRC) of DH took the opportunity of The Hong Kong Lesbian and Gay Film Festival (HKLGFF) to promote HIV/AIDS prevention in September 2014. During this key event of the gay community, health messages were conveyed through festival trailer, facebook and websites, posters, guidebooks, photo exhibition and other educational materials. The short film "For Love, We Can" produced by the RRC and directed by the Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts in 2014 was screened during the festival. "The Circle" and "Nomansland", which

were about acceptance of gay community and HIV infection, were also

recommended.

#### For Love, We Can screenshot

For Love, We Can, produced by RRC and directed by HKAPA, describes a gay couple struggling through family relationships and the dread HIV/AIDS.



#### The Circle screenshot

"The Circle" is a documentary based on a real couple and the events around an underground gay magazine and club in the 1950's, with commentary by the couple themselves. This film has received critical acclaim and won the Teddy Award for Best Documentary film highlighting lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) themes at the 2014 Berlin International Film Festival, and the

Panorama Audience Award for best documentary.

Nomansland describes the struggle faced by a man whose partner has just committed suicide having known he's got HIV.


