HIV epidemiology in 2018

There were a total of 624 HIV cases and 139 AIDS cases reported to the Department of Health (DH) in 2018. Cumulatively, DH received 9715 HIV reports and 1996 AIDS cases as of 2018. The number of HIV reports decreased by about 8.4% in 2018 as compared with 2017.

Of the 624 HIV cases, 530 males and 94 females, reported in 2018, 363 (58%) acquired the infection via homosexual or bisexual contact, 138 (22%) via heterosexual contact and three (0.5%) via drug injection. The routes of transmission of the remaining 120 cases (19.2%) have yet to be determined due to inadequate information at the time of reporting.

Majority of the cases (nearly 80%) were diagnosed HIV-positive at the age range of 20-49 years old. The overall median age of cases in 2018 was 36. MSM cases (median age of 31) were younger than heterosexual female cases (41.5) and heterosexual male cases (44). Seventy-two percent of the cases were of Chinese ethnicity.

The commonest reporting source in 2018 was public hospitals/clinics/laboratories (44.9%), followed by private hospitals/clinics/laboratories (15.5%) and DH's Social Hygiene Clinics (14.4%).

A majority of the 139 AIDS cases reported in 2018 were male (78%) and Chinese (77%); 57% acquired the virus through homosexual or bisexual contact and 37% via heterosexual route. Most AIDS patients had their HIV infections diagnosed at public hospitals and clinics (81%).

Pneumocystis pneumonia and tuberculosis remained as the two commonest AIDS-defining illnesses (ADI) in Hong Kong in 2018. They accounted for 66% of all new AIDS reports in 2018.
