The XIIth meeting of AIDS Services

March. Member were briefed on the
progress made by AIDS Concern on its
service development. They were particularly
interested in their initiative of bringing soup to
patients and organising transport services for
those who need to attend followup at clinics
in the public service. At the same meeting,
representatives of the Council of Social
Service gave a summary of its efforts in
stimulating and coordinating the participation
of voluntary agencies in the care of people
living with HIV/AIDS, as well as its
education programmes.

#### Activities

#### Seminar for Health Care Workers

AN open seminar was organised jointly by the Department of Health's AIDS Unit and Queen Elizabeth Hospital for health care workers on two 'hot topics' on HIV management - prevention of perinatal HIV transmission and combination antiretroviral treatment for HIV infection. Two leading experts gave presentations at the seminar - Professor David Cooper from St Vincent's Hospital, Sydney, and Dr John Ziegler from Sydney Children's Hospital. The function was held on 27 March at Queen Elizabeth Hospital with the participation of some 50 doctors and nurses from various hospitals and clinical units.

## Targeting travellers

ON 21 March, Mr CK Cheung led the Task Force on Media and Publicity to launch a new campaign at the Lo Wu Checkpoint to remind travellers of the threat of AIDS. Passport holders containing AIDS messages were distributed, together with condom flyers and postcards. About 2000 sets of publicity materials had been given out.

Mr CK Cheung is the convener of the Task Force under of the Committee on Education and Publicity on AIDS (CEPAIDS).

#### Course for Nurses

FOR the fifth consecutive year, an introductory course on AIDS is organised jointly by the Department of Health and the School for Professional and Continuing Education (SPACE) of the University of Hong Kong.

# What'son

## Professor Luc Montagnier,

dicoverer of the AIDS virus, was in Hong Kong lately as an invited speaker of the IX Asian Congress of Paediatrics. He gave a plenary lecture on the advances of the virology of AIDS on 25 March. He also gave a presentation at a

workshop on the same day. Other overseas speakers at the workshop are: Dr John Ziegler from Sydney, and Prof Usa Thisyakorn from Bangkok.



#### SEX HOTLINE

ON 21 March 1997, the Hong Kong Sex Education Association and the Department of Health jointly held a press meeting to announce the very satisfactory response of the public towards the Dr Sex Hotline. Since its lauching on 20 July 1996, the interactive hotline has received a total of 200,000 calls. About half of the callers are aged between 11

and 20, whereas children at or under the age of 10 accounts for 17.8%. The physiological, psychological and behavioural aspects of sex are the most popular messages chosen by the callers. Messages on STD and AIDS can also be accessed through the same Hotline.

The Hotline is one of the means of integrating STD/AIDS education in the wider context of sex education in the community. Starting from March 1997, the hotline messages can be heard not only in Cantonese and English but also in Putonghua.

### Seeing is believing

Focus

ON 17 March 1997, members of AIDS
Services Development
Committee visited new services under development for people living with HIV/AIDS in Hong Kong. Two hospices were visited - the hospice unit of Haven of Hope Hospital and "The Lookout" of the Society for AIDS Care.

Located in Tseung Kwan O, the Haven of Hope Hospital houses one of the oldest hospice units in Hong Kong. Originally planned for taking in cancer patients, the unit now has a total of 23 hospice beds. The unit also takes in patients with other diseases, e.g. Motor Neurone Disease. In June 1996, the first AIDS patient was admitted. The Unit was beginning to look after the fourth patient.

In preparing the

'new' service, Haven of
Hope Hospital conducted
training for all levels of staff.
Overseas training was
arranged for professional
staff of the hospital. The
administration is pleased
that staff have been very
receptive of the new
initiative. The unit is
prepared to take in 8-10
AIDS pateints in the
coming year.

The Lookout is located in Tai Po. Run by the Society for AIDS Care, the facility is designed specifically for AIDS patients. Five beds would be used in the first phase beginning the end of March 1997. The Lookout provides a comfortable and homely environment for patients. It is staffed by two doctors and a team of nurses of the Society.

Members also took the chance to go past the building sites of two projects of the Department of Health where services for HIV/AIDS patients will be provided. These are the primary health care centres in Kowloon Bay and Fanling. Outside the Kowloon Bay site, banners had been set up by residents in protest against the construction.

The trip has been a useful one for members to familiarise with the actual operation of AIDS services and their development in Hong Kong. The visit covered designated services and integrated services, and from primary and day care to hospice services.
