

THE AIDS Services **Development Committee** (ASDC) is working together with the Equal **Opportunities Commission** to come up with a booklet on the rights of people living with HIV/AIDS. Knowing that HIV/AIDS has been included as one form of disability under the Disability Discrimination Ordinance, the Committee feels it important not just to educate the public but to alert HIV/AIDS patients of what constitutes discrimination, what their rights is, and what action can be taken and how. The subject was discussed a a recent meeting of ASDC held on 13 June at the Red Ribbon Centre.



#### SCA meets

THE Scientific Committee on AIDS shall be meeting on 7 July. On the agenda are the following subjects for the delibertaion of the Committee: (a) reviewing the unlinked anonymous screening programme in Hong Kong; (b) external quality assurance on HIV testing; (c) TB/HIV; (d) revision to the recommended guidelines on the management of needlestick injuries in health care settings. The Committee is chaired by Professor M H Ng.

#### Sculpture for World AIDS Day

MR VAN LAU, a renowned local sculptor, is now working on a sculpture to commemorate Hong Kong's fight against AIDS. The art piece will also serve to slert members of the public of the threat of HIV/AIDS, and the need to work together to prevent further spread of the infection and to care for those infected.

The 'sculpture' is one of the important projects of the Task Force on Media and Publicity of the Committee on Education and Publicity on AIDS for this year. If all go well, the sculpture will be unveiled on the coming World AIDS Day on 1 December The Committee is identifying suitable location to set up the art piece. Any suggestions?
