World AIDS Campaign

THE theme of this year's World AIDS Campaign is Force for Change - World AIDS Campaign with Young People. Around the world, series of activities will be launched on or around 1 December - the World AIDS Day. Dr Peter Piot, Executive Director of UNAIDS, presented the new 1998 AIDS Epidemic Update on 24 November in London, setting scene for this years' campaign.

Community organisations are holding different activities to commemorate this day, to arouse awareness of the public on AIDS prevention and care, and to demonstrate our commitment towards it. Cumulative HIV/AIDS Statistics in Hong Kong updated 30 September 1998



A Unique Conference

ON 14 and 15 November. over 350 people participated in the *HOPE* Worldwide Health Corps Conference titled Prevention of AIDS in Asia: an update. The function was hosted by **HOPE** Worldwide and Harvard AIDS Institute, with the Advisory Council functioning as the local partner. Local participants are sponsored by the AIDS Trust Fund. Some forty to fifty of the participants were from the Mainland, a similar number from Hong Kong, and the rest from around the world.

There were four main sessions in the didactic lecture series. given by leading experts in their fields. The themes of the four sessions were: (1) defining the problem, (2) translating medical advances into effective management, (3) patient support and care, and (4) the social and behavioural context. The programmes were accredited for medical education by local medical colleges and University of Southern California. Unlike major

international or regional conferences on AIDS, the programme was more focussed on health problems and how to deal with them.

Among the speakers were Professor James Chin of UC Berkeley, Mr Mead Over of World Bank, Professor Chen Chunming from Mainland China, Professor Alexandra Levine of University of Southern California. Professor Max Essex of Harvard AIDS Institute. Participants showed keen interest in the presentations, and almost all stayed through the tightly packed programme lasting for over 12 hours.

After the lecture series, a majority of the participants joined the field experiences organised in three countries - Mainland China, Cambodia and the Philipines. The Red Ribbon Centre organised an open day on 13 and 16 November to receive some delegates who were staying in Hong Kong. Other informal gatherings were held during the few days. Some speakers were also invited to give presentations



at other functions hosted by professional organisations.

Two pressentations were given by local people - Dr Homer Tso of the Council discussed about the impacts of advocacy in AIDS prevention and care. He illustrated his points from three case studies collected from Hong Kong. Dr SS Lee talked about the changing philosophy of developing HIV care programmes, highlighting international development and making reference also to Hong Kong's progress.

The Conference began with a press meeting on 13 November, which was followed by a welcome reception well attended by many participants. All Advisory Council members had been invited to the reception to make new friends and re-establish old acquaintances.

The Council wishes to thank everyone who has contributed towards the success of the Conference, and appreciate the efforts of HOPE Worldwide, Harvard AIDS Institute and University of Southern California for putting together the excellent programmes.
